even if your child is acutely ill, you need an appointment in our practice. Before you are forwarded directly to our appointment page via the button below and can make an appointment, we ask you to read the following explanations.

If you feel that your child is a life-threatening emergency, dial 112!

#### Information on acute consultation hours

We have decided to offer appointments for acute appointments preferably online. We hope that your waiting time will be noticeably shortened. Acute illnesses are usually illnesses or symptoms that do not last longer than 14 days. For all symptoms lasting longer than two weeks, we ask you to make an appointment in our regular consultation hours by phone or via contact form on our homepage (Menü>Service>Terminvereinbarung).

Acute illnesses include the many infections that your child naturally undergoes in order to train his immune system. Not every one of these, sometimes feverish, infections must be presented to a paediatrician. However, the decision whether you need a paediatrician appointment depends on your assessment of the situation and your previous experience.

If you are unsure, make an appointment!

If you have problems with online appointments or are unsure whether you should introduce your child, you can still call us or come by in person. Please note our new telephone office hours.

#### Illness outside our office hours

If your child falls ill outside our office hours or on weekends and in your opinion an consultation cannot wait until our next acute consultation hours, the medical on-call service (ÄBD) is there for you. On Wednesday afternoons and weekends, these are even our colleagues from the paediatric on-call service (KinderÄBD).

In such cases, you will receive a telephone consultation under the number 116117.
